



SAFETY OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

PORTABLE LIGHTS

DANGER! Ensure the hirer shows you how to use the equipment. Read the instructions on this page BEFORE using the equipment.

Safety Instruction for This Equipment

- Ensure combustible material is kept away from the floodlight.
- Use the handle to adjust the beam.
- Allow the lights to cool for ten minutes before storing.
- Ensure light cannot topple over when being used in a crowded or confined space.
- Don't touch the tube with bare hands.
- Don't position floodlight closer than one metre from the surface to be illuminated.
- Don't allow power cable to come in contact with the front of the floodlight or housing.
- Check the floodlight or housing are not hot before touching.
- Don't allow overhanging shrubs or foliage to come into contact with the floodlight.
- Don't place or operate the flood light closer than 5 metres to a swimming pool or spa.
- Don't operate the floodlight with the front of the housing opened.

Electrical Safety

- Never use the tool in damp or wet places, and never expose them to rain unless specifically designed for that purpose.
- Do not handle the plug or unit with wet hands.
- Do not use the tool in the presence of flammable liquids or gases unless specifically designed for that purpose.
- Never carry tool from the cord or yank it to disconnect from the receptacle. Keep cord from heat, oil, and sharp edges. Never use machine if the cord is cut, cracked, worn or damaged.
- Never risk unconditional starting when plugging in the tool. Confirm the switch is in the off position before inserting the power plug in the receptacle.
- Do not touch movable parts or accessories unless the power source has been turned off.
- Always disconnect the tool before changing accessories.
- When not in use, tools should be stored, placed out of reach of the children.
- Never lock switches in 'ON' position with tape, wire or by any other means.
- Wherever possible always use an electrical safety switch (ELCB/RCD) when operating this equipment.

General Safety

- Do not use plant if you feel tired or under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- Where fitted keep guards in place during plant operation.
- Do not touch moving parts unless the equipment has been disabled.
- Do not wear loose clothing, gloves, neckties, rings, bracelets or other jewellery, which may get caught in the moving parts.
- Do not overreach. Ensure proper footing and balance when working with the equipment.
- Always keep the work area lit and free of rubbish.
- Never permit children, other people or animals to loiter near the work area.
- Do not fool around while operating, always keep the equipment under control.
- Operator must be physically able to handle the workload.
- Do not use near flammable or explosive materials.
- Do not use or continue to use faulty or damaged equipment. Check the condition of the plant at the end of each day and report any damage or defects.
